Our tamariki should be given the opportunity to experience success in all areas of life, thus growing their self-belief and enhancing and promoting ownership of learning for each individual.


I look forward to working with your tamariki this term.

Term One: Starts on Monday 27th January but we have two Teacher Only days at the start of the term on Monday

### SCHOOL STRUCTURE:

With it being extra hot at school we have decided to trial the shorter lunch times for Term One. This may also help the van avoid some of the traffic on the bridges as we will be finishing at 2.45pm.

7.30am Van run starts 8.30am Children arrive at school Breakfast is available for those that want it 9.00am School starts - first block 10.30am Morning tea break 11.00am Second block 12.30pm Lunch break (10 minutes eating time) 1.15pm Third block 2.15pm Swimming / other activities 2.45pm Home time 3.45pm All children should be home

The school day will also look slightly different in the classroom and we will send home more information on this in the first few weeks of school. Our aim is to incorporate more developmental activity based learning through a cultural lens, and enriching our school values.

## SCHOOL VAN:
